PRINCIPLE

Map both fronts before you act

Sun Tzu demands assessment before engagement. You cannot build a strategy for your child's future without mapping your own exposure to AI displacement. The parent who holds both maps simultaneously gains the capacity to act while others are still reacting.

REMEMBER

30% of work hours could be automated by 2030

McKinsey data shows that **up to 30 percent of hours worked globally** could be automated by 2030, with generative AI accelerating displacement in knowledge work. If you are not mapping your own exposure, you cannot guide your child toward skills that will matter. Assessment is not optional anymore.

THIS WEEK

Three moves to run now

- List five tasks you perform at work that involve predictable analysis or template execution. Estimate what percentage could be handled by current AI tools. Write the number down. This is your exposure.
- Ask your child to show you one assignment they completed recently. Walk through it together. Ask them which parts they did independently and which parts they used tools for. Do not judge. Map the dependency.
- Create a shared document: two columns. One for skills you are losing to AI at work. One for skills your child is not building because they can outsource them. Look for overlap. That is your battlefield.

CORE INSIGHT

Most parents are fighting the AI disruption blind—reacting to school policy changes, scrambling after tutors, chasing the latest app—without understanding the actual terrain their child will navigate or the skills that will matter in five years. The dual assessment Sun Tzu demands is not abstract philosophy: you must map your own exposure to AI displacement and your child's emerging capability gaps simultaneously, because the two fronts are connected. The parent who calculates before acting builds advantage; the parent who waits for clarity loses time they cannot recover.
